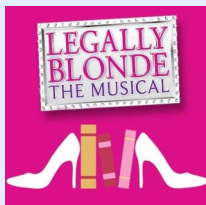


Legally Blonde

After a short illness, Cynthia passed away on 4 July, 2019. Cynthia was loved by everyone in Centre Stage, the Community Centre and by all those that she met. She will be dearly missed by us all. Cynthia was a welcoming face to the Centre and was always kind, caring and devoted so much of her time to helping and organising many things within the Centre.

Cynthia was one of our founding members of the Community Centre. She became involved with Centre Stage when she came to help in the kitchen on our very first show then started helping for the next show on a Sunday at rehearsals. By the time the next panto came around Cynthia took over as Secretary and did this role for over 20 years. Cynthia also made costumes for the shows and was generally the font of all knowledge. As well as being involved with Centre Stage she was also the Booking Secretary for the Community Centre, and was on various Committees within the Centre.

In the past Cynthia worked as Shop Assistant in a fruit shop and at 16 was a Typist for Power Gas. She was married to Ronnie and they had two children, Peter and Vicky and two grandchildren, Toby and Alexandra and spent 20 years looking after her mum and dad through their ill health. In her spare time, which wasn't much, Cynthia enjoyed doing crafts, knitting, sewing etc and also enjoyed cruising with her husband. However, her favourite pastime was spending time with her grandchildren.

The Community Centre was very important to Cynthia and it played a big part in her life. She gave so much of her time helping run things within the Centre and supporting those that used it, for that we thank her and will always keep her close in our hearts. The family asked for donations to the MacMillan charity instead of flowers for the funeral, which we did. Since then the Centre held a MacMillan Coffee Morning on behalf of Cynthia and raised a further £800. The family were very grateful and wrote;
